

With the Master on Our Knees—Lesson 1—Psalm 145—A Prayer of Pure Praise!

1. Read Psalm 145 and list all the attributes of God that you see.

2. Memorize Psalm 145: 1,2

3. (a) Using a Bible Dictionary, (or some other help), look up these attributes of God and write down their definitions. (b) How does this help you better understand who God is? (NOTE: If you don't have any Biblical helps, use a regular dictionary. The meaning perhaps won't be as rich, but it will do!)

4. In thinking back over the David's life, how were these attributes of God manifested towards him? Recall as many as you can. If you need to, scan 1 and 2 Samuel for help.

4. (a) According to the following verses, what things were shared from generation to generation? Exodus 12:25-28; Exodus 13:11-16; Deuteronomy 6:6-9; Joshua 4:19-24; Psalm 44:1-3; Psalm 71:18; Psalm 78:1-7. (b) Why was it important to pass things down to the next generation? (c) What are you passing down to your children regarding the works and mighty acts of God? (See Psalm 145:4)

5. David says in Psalm 145:5 that he will speak of the glorious honor or God's majesty and declare His wondrous works. Determine this week speak to at least two people of God's majesty and mighty works and come prepared to share how God used it.

6. (a) Looking back at question number one, how has God manifested these attributes in your life?
(b) Have you stopped to praise and thank Him?

7. (a) After meditating on the attributes of God, which one stands out as especially lacking in your own life? (b) How can we pray for you in this area so that you might become more like Him? Please write it down in the form of a prayer request.
